REPORTS:

Bookkeeper- Jennifer Link - Jennifer had some catching up on last months bills. The 2026 tax money (\$198,197 HWY, \$201,555 General Funds, \$29,737.22 Fireman Fund) was not included in the report but was received. First quarter Sales Tax \$90,889.55 down about \$6000 from last year. Other Revenue was reported for February and March.

Budget Officer: Bill Dashnaw – quiet for a few months then we will start in the budget again.

Building Code: Tim Tuttle- Have not received New Code Books.(most others have)

Tim has a meeting with lawyer for 4/4/26 for further work with juke issues. Tim will be away for the next couple of weeks or more, he can still be reached by phone or email for building permits. Postal system has not been sending back green cards (for certified mail) delaying some of the cleanup actions.

Planning Board – Kathleen VanSant – There were no subdivisions this month. The new law book was printed and received. A copy was given to each member, for review. They discussed the Tire Dumpster but nothing concrete because it is still a little early. John Nixon wants to resign as chair but still wants to be on the committee. No one stepped up, so they decided on seniority, and that would be Ed Hockenbery. They all nominated him because he was absent from the meeting.

Dog Control – Dan Moyer – One stray dog was returned to owner.

Assessor – Mark Schnorr – Assessor working on data collection for building permits taken out in 2025. Tentative assessment roll to be filed on May 1st.

OLD BUSINESS:

New furnace in garage working well. **Bill Law** showed **George Blatchley, Richard Youngs,** and **Shawn Clark** before the meeting. **Shawn Clark** asked the total cost. It was between \$7300 and \$7400.

A discussion followed, about the Wildwood property prospects, between **Tim Tuttle** and the **Town Board**.

George Blatchley would like a 10% Tax Reduction for volunteer Fire Fighters and EMS workers. It would be on property they own and live in. Must work for 2 years as volunteer firefighter or EMS worker, before they can apply. Whoever gets it would have to be monitored to show that they still qualify. **George Blatchley** said it would be him, as supervisor. **Mark Schnoor** will talk with our attorney about making a town law.

NEW BUSINESS:

Members of the Museum ask **George Blatchley** if we could contribute to purchasing flags on four cemeteries for the Veterans. They said they need 250 flags. After a discussion, it was decided **Shawn Clark** would get prices for next month's meeting.
